



Frequently Asked Questions About Measure HH Fountain Valley Police/911 Response/Essential City Services Measure

Q: What is Measure HH and what is it designed to address?

A: Since 2012, Sacramento has taken \$116 million dollars from the City of Fountain Valley. Measure HH is a one-cent local sales tax which has been placed on the November 2016 ballot. If enacted, revenue generated by the measure will fund Fountain Valley's essential public safety and essential city services with a reliable source of locally-controlled funding that can't be taken by Sacramento.

Q: What priorities will Measure HH address?

A: Fountain Valley residents and the Police and Fire Departments have identified the following priorities:

- ✓ Maintain 911 emergency response, neighborhood patrols and special crime suppression units that fight gangs and drugs
- ✓ Keep both Fountain Valley fire stations open
- ✓ Provide up-to-date mission critical safety equipment, communication devices, and response apparatus
- ✓ Maintain police cadet recruitment and training programs, and front desk service
- ✓ Maintain school crossing guards/school resource officers
- ✓ Upgrade emergency 911 emergency radio communication and equipment

Q: How do I know funds will be spent properly?

A: Measure HH requires strict fiscal accountability provisions, public spending reports, and annual independent audits. By law, all funds are required to remain local for the benefit of the Fountain Valley community.

Q: Is Measure HH a property tax?

A: No. Measure HH is NOT a tax on property or a tax on prescription medication or food purchased as groceries.
